Nouns

A noun is a single word that names a person, place or thing:

Person: Hannah, Samir, Theo, boy, girl

Place: England, home, school, park

Thing: table, pencil, bus, cat

Capital letters for proper nouns:

The house was owned by James. Tomorrow is Tuesday.

Singular and Plural Nouns

singular cat, dog, cake, box, dish

-s plural: cats, dogs, cakes

-es plural: boxes dishes

Types of Nouns

Abstract nouns (you can feel but cannot touch/ do not have a physical form):

love, disaster, friendship, courage, knowledge

Proper nouns (names):

ideas	concepts	emotion	traits
life	religion	love	kindness
death	democracy	fear	patience
pleasure	history	misery	elegance

Concrete nouns (physical things):

table, chair, book, damage

Collective nouns (a collection or group of people, objects or people):

A flock of birds
