


A coordinating conjunction links to nouns or two adjectives and two main clauses:

and but or so


I might go swimming or play outside.

A coordinating conjunction links to nouns or two adjectives and two main clauses:


and but or so yet

A subordinating conjunction starts a subordinate clause:


because if when
