

Commas can be used between two adjectives:

The deep, blue water looked inviting.

The ship has an enormous, white sail.

The surprise is hidden in a large, wooden chest.



Commas can be used in a list of three or more:

The room was covered with dust, cobwebs and mould.

Tomorrow I am going to wake up, brush my teeth and get to work.



Commas are not for a pause.

Commas can be used:

- In a list
- After a fronted adverbial
- After a subordinate clause
- For non-finite clauses
- For relative clauses
- To mark parenthesis
- With speech marks
